CAMP WILLIAM PENN
Here was Pennsylvania's only training camp for African American soldiers - and the largest of 18 in the nation - during the Civil War. Comprising over 10,000 men, 11 regiments of U.S. Colored Troops were trained here: the 3rd, 6th, 8th, 22nd, 24th, 25th, 32nd, 41st, 43rd, 45th, & 127th. Recruits first arrived on June 26, 1863; many were to fight in Virginia, South Carolina, Florida, and elsewhere. The camp closed August 14, 1865.




He was proud to be an American who served his country. Andrew Askins Post #479 was very special to "T".




